Jessie Auger, 2007 Massachusetts Teacher of the Year, teaches first grade in English and Spanish at the Rafael Hernandez two-way bilingual school in Roxbury. She has a deep commitment to her community as a teacher, learner, and citizen, and being bilingual is of vital importance to her participation in the community. Over the course of 16 years of teaching, she has worked locally, nationally, and internationally to foster educational excellence. This includes quality early childhood education programs and a belief that equity in educational resources means everyone receives quality, high-level instruction. As a kindergarten teacher, she has worked to individualize every student's lessons, helped write and receive grants to fund literacy programs, and was an integral part of a multi-faceted school staff effort that impacted her school's dramatic rise in standardized test scores and achievement.

In keeping with these accomplishments, Oliver makes sure each and every child she influences has the greatest amount of support from school and community.
